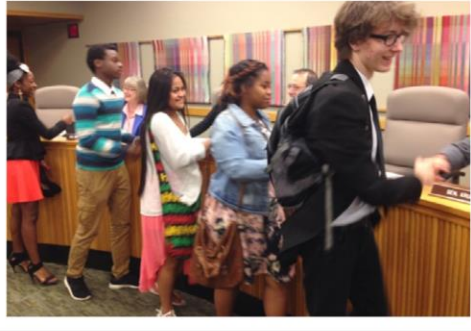
Core Values

Accomplishments

REAP has a 4-year graduation rate of 90% for 2014 in comparison to Oregon's 4-year graduation rate for 2013 was 68.7% and in Multnomah County school districts graduation rate of 66.6%. In addition, REAP has a 76% college enrollment rate in comparison to 61% of Oregon High School Graduates college enrollment rate.

Solutions – A year around leadership program that engages student voice among business and community leaders.
