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Asbestos

The Asbestos Hazard Emergency Response Act of 1986 (AHERA) required school districts to inspect their buildings for asbestos and develop a written plan to manage asbestos containing materials. David Douglas School District inspected schools in 1988, and the District's AHERA Management Plan was developed based on that information.

Following AHERA requirements, periodic surveillances of asbestos-containing materials in each building are completed every six months and full re-inspections are completed every three years. AHERA Management Plans are available at each school for public review or by submitting a request to David Callaway.

Carbon Monoxide Detectors

David Douglas School District No. 40 certifies that all buildings subject to the Healthy and Safe Schools Plan comply with the carbon monoxide detection standards in the state building code that was in effect when the building was originally constructed or as required by building code due to addition, upgrade, or remodel.

Integrated Pest Management

David Douglas School District No. 40 has adopted an Integrated Pest Management (IPM) plan as required by ORS 634.700 through 634.750. Community members can access a copy of the IPM plan here:

Lead

Elevated Levels of Lead in Water Used for Drinking or Food Preparation

David Douglas School District utilizes the EPA's 3T technical in testing for lead in its facilities' drinking water. Lead in drinking water occurs either due to pollution in the water or corrosion of service pipes or fixtures. The EPA's guidance is located at <https://www.epa.gov/ground-water-and-drinking-water/3ts-reducing-lead-drinking-water-toolkit>. The District has a testing protocol using an OHA-accredited drinking water laboratory to analyze samples for lead.

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The EPA's recommended action level is 0.020 mg/L (equivalent to 20 parts per billion (ppb) for organizations who are on a public water supply; the District uses the 0.015 mg/L as a trigger to identify areas that may need further investigation.

All repairs, upgrades, and new construction in the District utilize "lead-free" components as the current District standard.

David Douglas School District tested bubblers in its buildings in 2013. As a result, the District repiped domestic water supplies to three schools, Cherry Park Elementary School, Menlo Park Elementary School, and Ventura Park Elementary School as well as to the main line and affected areas at the South Campus building of David Douglas High School.

During 2016, the facilities department mapped the fixtures in all the District's buildings and identified them using a standard naming convention. This naming convention includes a number with an identifier for the type of fixture as noted in the table below:

F=faucet

B=Bubbler

DF = Drinking Fountain

IM=Ice Machine

Bradley = Bradley sink

The District's plan to reduce exposure to lead is as follows:

- a. **Identify sources:** The District will test fixtures used for drinking water or food preparation.
- b. **Discontinue use:** When elevated lead levels are discovered, the District will try to determine the source of the issue. The fixture will be placed out of order and may either be disabled while being replaced or discontinued from use. Signage may be used to identify fixtures not used for drinking.
- c. **Communicate results:** Test results are communicated to the site and district administration. The District's Communication Department will notify students, families, and the community.
- d. **Access to water:** The District will provide water in instances where no other sources of water exist in the facility.
- e. **Resolve issues where possible:** After identification, the District will mitigate and correct issues where possible and will retest to determine if the issue persists.
- f. **Monitoring:** The District will have a testing schedule so that fixtures providing water for drinking or food preparation will be tested on a rotating basis every six years. The District may do more frequent testing dependent upon results of the tests.

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All school districts, education service districts, and public charter schools are required to test for and eliminate exposure to elevated levels of lead in water used for Drinking and Food Preparation through either remediation or eliminating access, according to OAR 333-061-0400 and OAR 581-022-2223. In conformance with those administrative rules, David Douglas School District No. 40 certifies the following:

1. All testing was done according to the testing requirements in OAR 333-061-0400;
2. All samples were analyzed by a lab accredited by Oregon Health Authority to test for those materials;
3. All water fixtures required to be tested under OAR 333-061-0400 were tested for elevated levels of lead in accordance with the testing schedule developed by the Oregon Health Authority; and
4. The testing schedule for each building covered by this plan is set forth below:

Lead Paint

David Douglas School District follows the Environmental Protection Agency's Renovation, Repair and Painting Program Rule requiring that individuals and firms conducting any renovations, repairs, and painting projects on pre-1978 "child-occupied" facilities be certified to follow lead-safe work practices.

Child-occupied facilities is defined by OAR 333-070-0085 as:

"Child-occupied facility" means a building, or a portion of a building, constructed prior to 1978, visited regularly by the same child, under age six, on at least two different days within any week (Sunday through Saturday), provided that each day's visit lasts at least three hours and the combined weekly visit lasts at least six hours, and the combined annual visits last at least sixty hours. Child-occupied facilities may include, but are not limited to, day-care centers, preschools and kindergarten classrooms. Child-occupied facilities may be located in target housing or in public or commercial buildings. With respect to common areas in public or commercial buildings that contain child-occupied facilities, the child-occupied facility encompasses only those common areas that are routinely used by children under age six, such as restrooms and cafeterias. In addition, with respect to exteriors of public or commercial buildings that contain child-occupied facilities, the child-occupied facility encompasses only the exterior sides of the building that are immediately adjacent to the child-occupied facility or the common areas routinely used by children under age six.

This rule distinguishes between abatement and a minor maintenance or repair. Any District employee or contractor that conducts any renovations, repairs or painting that meet the criteria of the Rule will possess a certification in lead-safe work practices. This rule allows the District to perform repairs when they meet the minor maintenance/repair definition as follows: minor maintenance or repair disrupting 6 square feet or less of paint per room or 20 square feet or less of exterior paint.

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Radon

David Douglas School District No. 40 has developed and implemented a radon plan as required by ORS 332.167. The plan details radon testing, retesting, and reporting procedures for all District-owned buildings. Following the plan, initial testing of all buildings was completed in December 2018. This plan tests for radon in any frequently occupied rooms in contact with the ground or located above a basement or crawlspace once every ten years.

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
Annual Communication
